



■ Capt Frederick James Haney MC DFC, Sefton Rugby Union Football Club. Picture courtesy of Jill Mapey

Clerk with the Bank of England. Won the Military Cross in WWI for conspicuous gallantry with King's Liverpool Regt.

■ Lt Frederick James Venmore MC (b.1889 Liverpool, KIA 1916 France)

Architect. Won the Military Cross in World War I for conspicuous gallantry with the Royal Welch Fusiliers.

■ Lt Leonard Charles Fenton Bellamy MC (b.1884 Birkenhead d.1964 Reading)

Won the Military Cross in WWI for conspicuous gallantry with the Royal Engineers. When Japan overran HK in 1941, he was interned at Stanley Camp (as was DJ Sloss).

■ 2nd Lt James William Archibald Taylor MC (b.1883 Liverpool d.1953 Westmorland)

Schoolteacher. Won the Military Cross in WWI for conspicuous gallantry with the Special Companies, Royal Engineers.

■ Capt James Brown MC (b.1886 Plumstead, London d.1945 Manchester)

Was MiD in 1918, then awarded the Military Cross for conspicuous gallantry with the Royal Garrison Artillery. Governor of Hull, Strangeways and Leicester prisons.

■ Capt Vivian



Arthur Fenton Bellamy AFC (b.1889 Liverpool d.1942 Isle of Man)

Was MiD for zeal and devotion to duty. Apparently he flew a dirigible back from France with a broken backbone. Awarded the Air Force Cross in 1919. After WWI, patented apparatus for mixing air and gas in airship engines. Chief Engineer of the Manx Electricity Board.

■ RSM Ernest Edward Bond DCM (b.1882 Lancaster d.1957 Southport)

Schoolteacher. Awarded the Distinguished Conduct Medal after WWI for distinguished services with the King Edward's Horse cavalry regiment.

■ Sgt Stanley John Kay MM and bar (b.1889 Liverpool d.1959 Liverpool)

Schoolteacher. Won the Military Medal twice in WWI for bravery in the field with the Royal Army Medical Corps.

■ Sgt Fred King MM (b.1892 Middlesbrough d.1982 Halton)

Schoolteacher. Won the Military Medal in WWI for bravery in the field with the Royal Army Medical Corps.

■ Prof Duncan John Sloss CBE MA LLD

■ Dr Robert Alun Roberts MM (b.1894 Liverpool d.1961 Neath)

Won the Military Medal in WWI for bravery in the field with the Royal Army Medical Corps. Major in South African Medical Corps in WW2. Radiologist in South Africa, consultant radiologist in Neath, Wales.

■ Robert Percy Scaddan MM (b.1894 Liverpool d.1949 Barton, Lancs)

Mercantile Insurance agent. Won the Military Medal in WWI for bravery in the field with the Royal Engineers.

■ Kenneth William Lascelles MM (b.1895 Liverpool d.1963 Liverpool)

Schoolteacher. Won the Military Medal in WWI for bravery in the field riding motorbikes with the Army Service Corps.

■ Sgt Bernard 'Barney' Wall MM (b.1909 Liverpool d.1975 Liverpool)

Won the Military Medal in WWII defending Malta with the Royal Artillery.

■ RQMS Joseph Fairley MSM (b.1884 Barnsley d.1952 Edmonton, Canada)

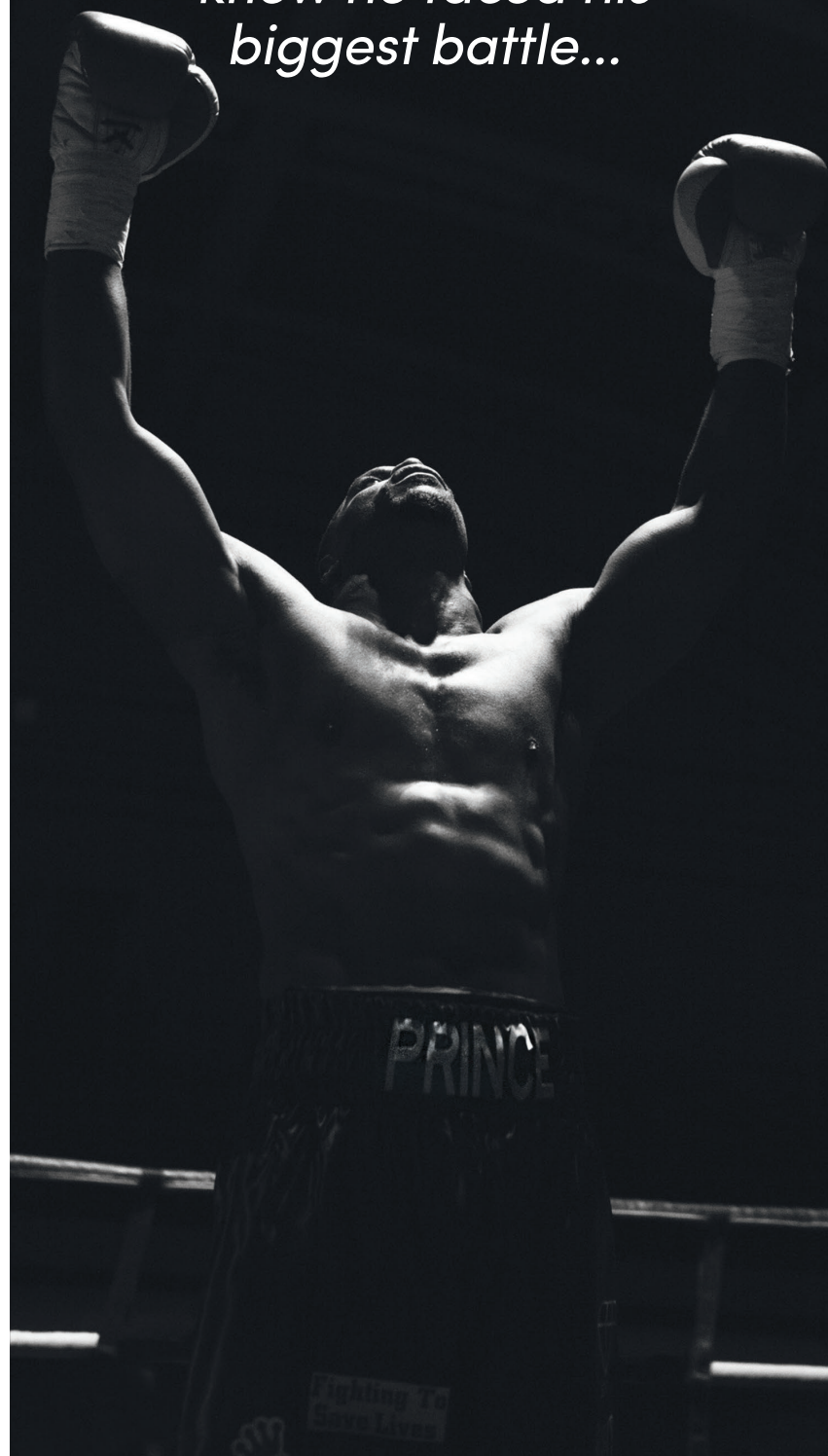
Schoolteacher. Was MiD in 1917 and awarded the Meritorious Service Medal for consistent good work and devotion to duty with the Canadian Infantry.

■ Pte Horace Viner MSM b. 1881 Dudley d.1935 Prescot)

Schoolteacher. Awarded the Meritorious Service Medal for good, faithful, valuable and meritorious service, with conduct judged to be irreproachable.
